a light shines in the darkness and the darkness has not overcome it

At the time of writing this, it is the middle of Holy Week, leading up to Resurrection Sunday. I'm struck by the juxtaposition of darkness vs. light, suffering vs. flourishing, and death vs. life that so powerfully marks this particular week. As Believers, we cannot ignore the reality and presence of darkness, evil, and suffering. It made its mark on our Savior, it makes its mark on the world at-large, and it leaves its mark on us.

The brokenness of humanity and the longing of this world for redemption is palpable. I've seen it on the faces of our new Field Partners in Nepal as they've shared the stories of persecution they experience while revealing the Good News in remote villages of the

Himalayas. I read about in the reports from our Field Partners in Myanmar as they withstand the atrocities of the civil war around them, while they provide care for those who are most vulnerable. I hear it in the voices of our Field Partners in Central Asia while we pray together over Zoom.

We can't deny the reality of darkness.

But. "A light shines in the darkness, and the darkness has not overcome it" (John 1). And therein lies our hope and our steadfast joy!

The Kingdom of God is on the move, and truly, it cannot be hidden! While darkness makes its mark, the ultimate victory is healing, flourishing, and life found in and through the resurrection of Christ. It ultimately wipes away those marks and heals all wounds.

And this truth is what we see lived out on a daily basis by our brave Field Partners in our 5 Locations. Though they face hardship and persecution, their light is not snuffed out. They are indeed cities on a hill, whose presence and light cannot be hidden but rather, beckons and invites all around them into the life-giving presence and light of Jesus. The light is not hidden; it is revealed both through the good deeds and the beautiful declaration of the Gospel expressed from our Field Partners.

This Impact Report gives a brief overview of what it looks like, tangibly, for the light to shine. And I want to personally say thank you. Thank you for helping the light shine in the darkness and being a part of God's story of redemption in this beautiful way!



Three years ago Uncharted started a partnership with leaders in the underground church in Central Asia and added these local believers to our team of Field Partners. Suffering from a government takeover, a country-wide hunger crisis, and a retreat to oppressive jurisdiction, many thought the church in this country was doomed. But our Partners have propelled into action–caring for the oppressed, giving food to the hungry, and boldly sharing the hope of Christ.

Despite the increased danger of persecution, our Partners in Central Asia are courageously creating innovative ways to serve their communities and bring about opportunities to introduce gospel conversations—specifically our Partner, I*. I* has been helping facilitate an underground school for girls as well as vocational training for women, where they're given the opportunity to learn a trade in carpet weaving or tailoring.


Over 270 young women are being taught in underground schools, some of them going on to become teachers themselves. Twenty-five women are receiving sewing training and 40 are learning carpet weaving, and they're finding work in their communities and local businesses.

Through these programs, and others like it run by our Field Partners, people are finding hope in what looks like a hopeless situation—including the hope of the gospel.

In 2023, 56 people in Central Asia heard the gospel for the first time. This number not only represents 56 potentially dangerous conversations for our Partners, but also the time invested in building trust, providing care, and developing 56 individual relationships. From those gospel conversations, 43 people chose to follow Christ and 33 new believers were baptized in bathtubs and remote lakes.

This work is not without risk to I* and our other Field Partners, to the teachers and students in underground schools, and to the families of those who participate in these programs. In 2023, we also provided help to a Field Partner who was forced, with his family, to flee his village in order to avoid capture by local authorities who discovered his role in the underground church. But instead of escaping to a neighboring country, he chose to rebuild his life in a different city and restart his ministry.

We are incredibly proud of the boldness and courage shown by our Field Partners in Central Asia, and are grateful for the opportunity to stand alongside them. Despite persecution, oppression, poverty, and the threat of violence, 2023 brought incredible fruit to the church in Central Asia—a reminder that nothing is stronger than the love of Christ.
